THIRTY-FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST - Sunday of The Prodigal Son

EPISTLE: A reading from the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians (6: 12-20)

Brothers and Sisters! "Everything is lawful for me" -- but that does not mean that everything is good for me. "Everything is lawful for me" -- but I will not let myself be enslaved by anything. "Food is for the stomach and the stomach for food, and God will do away with them both in the end-" but the body is not

for immorality; it is for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body. God, who raised up the Lord, will raise us also by his power. Do you not see that your bodies are members of Christ? Would you have me take Christ's members and make them the members of a prostitute? God forbid! Can you not see that the man who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? Scripture says, "The two shall become one flesh." But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Shun lewd conduct. Every other sin a man commits is outside his body, but the fornicator sins against his own body. You must know that your body is temple of the Holy Spirit, who is within -- the Spirit you have received from God. You are not your own. You have been purchased, and at a price. So, glorify God in your body.

ALLELUIA VERSE: Your mercies, O Lord, I will sing forever; from generation to generation, I will announce Your truth with my mouth.

For You have said: Mercy shall be built up for ever; in the heavens Your truth shall be prepared. GOSPEL: Luke 15: 11-32

At that time the Lord told this parable: "A man had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the estate that is coming to me.' He longed to fill his belly with the husks that were fodder for the pigs, but no one made a move to give him anything. Coming to his senses at last, he said: 'How many hired hands at my father's place have more than enough to eat, while here I am starving! I will break away and return to my father, and say to him, Father, I have sinned against God and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son. Treat me like one of your hired hands.' With that he set off for his father's house. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him and was deeply moved. He ran out to meet him, threw his arms around his neck, and kissed him. The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against God and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' The father said to his servants; 'Quick! bring out the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and shoes on his feet. Take the fatted calf and kill it. Let us eat and celebrate because this son of mine was dead and has come back to life. He was lost and is found.' Then the celebration began. Meanwhile the elder son was out on the land. As he neared the house on his way home, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked him the reason for the dancing and the music. The servant answered, 'Your brother is home, and your father has killed the fatted calf because he has him back in good health.' The son grew angry at this and would not go in; but his father came out and began to plead with him. He said to his father in reply: 'For years now I have slaved for you. I never disobeyed one of your orders, yet you never gave me so much as a kid goat to celebrate with my friends. Then, when this son of yours returns after having gone through your property with loose women, you kill the fatted calf for him.' 'My Son,' replied the father, 'you are with me always, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice! This brother of yours was dead, and has come back to life. He was lost, and is found." "


SOROKOUSTY SERVICES - ALL SOULS SATURDAYS

Sorokousty Services (All Souls Saturdays) will be celebrated this year on February 19th, March 12th, March 19th and June 4th.


The word "Sorokousty" literally means "forty mouths" (sorok = forty; ust = mouth). Originally, this was a prayer service offered by forty mouths or by forty priests especially in Lenten time.

Sorokousty or All Souls Saturdays services have been celebrated for the deceased by holding Liturgies, panakydas or parastas for them in five Saturdays (This year only four Saturdays are scheduled because The Feast of The Archangel Gabriel replaces the fourth All Souls Saturday, but for pastoral reason a Panakhyda may be sung on that day).

Each family in our parish has a book or a list where the names of deceased family members are written. Father reads out every book or list during each Sorokousty.



Government Of Saskatchewan Donates To Humanitarian Aid For Ukraine

Released on January 31, 2022

Today, the Government of Saskatchewan announced a \$100,000 donation to support, coordinate and deliver humanitarian aid in Ukraine.

Valentine's Day, also called Saint Valentine's Day or the Feast of Saint Valentine, is celebrated annually on February 14. It originated as a Christian feast day honoring one or two early Christian martyrs named Saint Valentine and, through later folk traditions, has become a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of romance and love in many regions of the world.

San Valentino of Terni

Terni city of San Valentino. Because, despite being celebrated in many parts of the world as the protector of lovers on the anniversary of February 14, Terni has an extraordinary bond with Valentine's Day, so much so that it is its Patron Saint. And if the message of love, in the fullness of its meaning, which he left us has a universal value, this city has welcomed it and made it its own. Valentino was bishop of Terni, or rather of Interamna - the toponym in Roman

times - in the 4th century. Recent studies have added new elements relating to the chronology of his life, which can be contexualized, in the IV century but in the following one. Consequently, the saint's martyrdom did not occur in 273 but probably in 347.

Valentino di Terni was martyred with the beheading carried out in secret along the Via Flaminia, near Rome, after being arrested, "guilty" of having pushed some young people to convert to Christianity, including the son of the philosopher Craton together with Proculus, Efebo and Apollonius, his pupils. The prefect of Rome, whose son had recently converted, was arrested and executed. Proculus, Efebo and Apollonio buried Valentino in a cemetery area just outside Terni, where the three young men were also buried, who suffered the same martyrdom.


In the fifth century, a first church was built on the burial site, which was then destroyed during the invasion of the Goths. This original construction (or perhaps a second one from the 6th century) was followed by a new construction in the 13th century, of larger dimensions. At the beginning of the seventeenth century, excavations were conducted under the church to exhume the body of the Saint, which was found with the bust separated from the head, confirming the martyrdom carried out with beheading. The remains of Saint Valentine are kept in

an urn (17th century) under the main altar of the present Basilica, begun in 1606. Stucco statues are placed on the 17th century facade (with Saint Valentine and Saint Anastasio in the upper part); they were added in the 19th century. The interior, with a nave, has many 17th century paintings, including those by Lucas De La Haye, a Carmelite monk: one of these is located in the chapel dedicated to Saint Teresa of Avila and portrays the "Madonna and Child between Saints Joseph and Teresa ". By the same artist are "St. Valentine invokes the protection of the Madonna on Terni" (central altarpiece) and "Adoration of the Shepherds" and "Adoration of the Magi".

In the chapel of San Michele there is an altarpiece by Giuseppe Cesari known as Cavalier d'Arpino (17th century) which depicts "San Michele defeating the devil". Andrea Polinori is the author of the canvas "Madonna and Child with Saints Lorenzo, Giovanni Battista and Bartolomeo" from 1635. On the altar of the Confession is the painting "Martyrdom of St. Valentine" (17th century).

On the lower floor of the Basilica, in addition to the crypt - which belongs to the medieval construction - you can visit the Museum where archaeological finds recovered during excavations are exhibited.





Mercy and Forgiveness

All that God looks for from us is the slightest opening and He forgives a multitude of sins.

... There were two brothers: they divided their father's goods between them and one stayed home, while the other went away to a foreign country, wasted all he had been given, and then could not bear the shame of his poverty. The son who went away represents those who fall after baptism. This is clear from the fact that he is called a son, since no one is called a son unless he is baptized. Also, he lived in his father's house and took a share of all his father's goods. Before baptism no one receives the Father's goods or enters upon the inheritance. We can therefore take all this as signifying the state of believers. What does he say after falling into the depths of evil? I will return to my father. The reason the father let him go and did not prevent his departure for a foreign land was so that he might learn well by experience what good things are enjoyed by the one who stays at home. For when words would not convince us God often leaves us to learn from the things that happen to us. When the dissolute returned after going to a foreign country and finding out by experience what a great sin it is to leave the father's house, the father did not remember past injuries but welcomed him with open arms. Why? Because he was a father and not a judge. And there were dances and festivities and banquets and the whole house was full of joy and gladness. Are you asking: "Is this what he gets for his wickedness?" Not for his wickedness, but for his return home; not for sin, but for repentance; not for evil, but for being converted. What is more, when the elder son was angry at this the father gently won him over, saying: You were always with me, but he was lost and has been found; he was dead and has come back to life. "When someone who was lost has to be saved," says the father, "it is not the time for passing judgment or making minute inquiries, but only for mercy and forgiveness."
